

On the 10th of February, the Tibetan Year of the Wood Dragon will begin. We will commemorate the 40th anniversary of the parinirvana of Lama Thubten Yeshe, co-founder of the FPMT. This celebration will be followed by the raising of the moon during two weeks, the Fifteen Days of Miracles (the full moon being *Choetrul Duchen*). It will be a very special time in Nalanda, as you will read below.

Dagpo Rinpoche.

Dagpo Rinpoche was recognized at an early age by the Thirteenth Dalai Lama as the reincarnation of one of the greatest Tibetan masters of the Gelug tradition. In 1959, Rinpoche left Tibet for India. He was soon invited to settle in France, where he founded the Guépèle Institute and the Gelug congregation Ganden Ling Institute.

This great master was invited to participate in **Nalanda's incoming first Gelug Monlam Festival**. Here is a translation of his answer, where he emphasizes the importance of this event to preserve the Gelug tradition of Lama Tsong Khapa:

Dear Gelong lags,

I thank you and your entire community for your kind invitation and for organizing a Monlam according to the Gelug tradition.


I am honored and touched that you thought of me, but to my great regret I will not be available during the last two weeks of February. I have other projects, planned for a long time.

I will not be able to be present physically, but be sure that I will join you in thought and prayer. I am indeed very grateful to you for undertaking this magnificent project, very precious for the sustainability and dissemination of the Teaching of the Buddha and the tradition of Je Rinpoche.

A SACRED CONNECTION BETWEEN LAY AND MONASTIC COMMUNITIES



Just as a healthy tree depends on having both roots and branches connected by a trunk, **the existence of Buddha Dharma depends on both ordained and lay practitioners** connected through practice. We need each other; we need to mutually appreciate, serve, and support one another in order to grow and flourish.

A primary responsibility of the ordained sangha is to devote their lives to studying, practicing, and sharing the Buddha's teachings, while the lay community who see the value of this provide material support to sustain the monastics.

A prayer festival is a special way of activating the sacred potential of this connection by celebrating our shared experience of the Dharma. Through prayer, offering, purification, teachings, and other practices we express our highest aspirations, our gratitude for the Buddha, Dharma, and Sangha, and for one another.

During the auspicious Days of Miracles, we reaffirm our determination to free all sentient beings from suffering by continually working to grow in kindness, compassion, wisdom, and all positive qualities.

Results only come about through bringing together the collections of causes able to produce those results. When many people gather together and collectively focus their energies on achieving a wholesome aim, causes to quickly achieve that aim are brought together and enjoyed by all. Inspired by others, each of our individual aspirations becomes stronger, and that in turn strengthens the goodness in others.

A prayer festival is therefore an incredibly important force to develop the best in each of us by honoring the Buddha Dharma that we hold most sacred.

A RAIN OF MERITS!



Since its inauguration in 1409, **the Great Prayer Festival** has been the most significant annual spiritual event in the Tibetan society. To this day it brings thousands of monastic and lay people together to pray for world peace, for spreading the Dharma, and for individuals' well-being.

The Great Prayer festival happens during the Fifteen Days of Miracles, which are commonly held by the Tibetan tradition to be especially auspicious and powerful days. Lama Zopa Rinpoche says that **the karma created during this period is multiplied by a 100 million.** Therefore, practicing generosity during this time is an especially good opportunity. Imagine, by giving just one euro or one cup of tea, it is like having given a hundred million!



During this first and historical Great Prayer Festival at Nalanda Monastery, **we are inviting everyone to support our Dharma projects.** Please help us to continue to create a thriving and modern Buddhist monastic university in the Western world, thus educating the realized scholars and yogis of the future, and creating a wisdom culture based on enlightenment.

The Monlam is a perfect time to practice the perfection of generosity. Your offerings could be used for different projects.

You may want to offer to cover expenses during the Great Prayer Festival, such as:

- **Plane tickets** for special guests, like the chanting master and two geshes from Sera Jey Monastery, India.
- **Tea** offered during the main prayer sessions (40€).
- Money offered to monastics during the ceremony (to your convenience).
- Electric "**butter lamps**" on the altar (5€ each). You offer 5€ to the monastery and the light that dispels the ignorance of all beings.



NEW PROGRAM: EXPLORING BUDDHISM






