Following the commentary Geshe Gyaltsen-la gave on Yamantaka practice and the retreat he led last year, some dedicated students requested Geshe-la to lead the retreat again in January 2025.

Yamantaka is the wrathful manifestation of Manjushri and was Tsongkhapa's personal deity-practice whom he instituted as the principal Gelug yidam-meditation practice to eliminate obstacles to one's spiritual practice. It is

considered one of the most important yidam practices to begin, both for monastic and lay practitioners alike.


To participate in the retreat, one must have received the full initiation of Yamantaka (tib. *wang*) from a qualified Tantric Guru and practice daily the 6 sessions of Guru yoga.

To participate in the peaceful fire puja organized at the end of the retreat, one will have to have recited the appropriate number of mantras on a cushion during the retreat.

Participation in the costs of the retreat and the fire puja is a suggestion for a minimum donation and should never be an obstacle. In case of need, please contact the director directly.

LHABAB DUCHEN: COMING DOWN FROM HEAVENS



Lhabab Duchen is one of the four great holy days of the Buddhist calendar during which the karmic results of our actions are multiplied 100 million times. It

celebrates Guru Shakyamuni Buddha's descent from the God Realm of the Thirty-Three.

To repay the gratitude of His mother Mahadevi who was reborn in this god realm, Lord Buddha went there to teach Dharma. After 3 months, the Buddha descended on a triple staircase made of Lapis lazuli, gold and crystal.


**Secular spirituality** offers a path to personal transformation without relying on religious belief, encouraging inner growth through practices like mindfulness and contemplation.

Following Lama Zopa Rinpoche's holy wish to bring the Monlam to the West, last February, Nalanda Monastery initiated the tradition of the <u>Gelug Monlam</u>

Festival in the West.

Beginning on Tibetan New Year's Day (Losar), 28 February 2025, the "15 Days

of Miracles" commemorate the time when the Buddha performed numerous

miracles to subdue the six non-Buddhist masters and inspire his followers to

greater faith in the Dharma.

The fifteenth day, *Tcheutroul duchèn*, is the day of the full moon, this year

Friday 14 March 2025. It's a particularly auspicious day when the merits

created are multiplied by 100 million.

Monasteries organize the festival of great prayers, the Monlam Chenmo.

Lama Tsongkhapa himself instituted the first edition of this festival in the Gelug

tradition in 1409.

The statue of Lama Tsongkhapa will be 115 centimetres high (the statues of the two disciples are slightly shorter) and will be of the highest quality made in Nepal. The estimated cost including postage is around €19,500.

But fortunes revolve till just imprints remain


Ephem'ral, inconstant, illusory—extinct?




## **FPMT Exploring Buddhism**


